But, the earliest plan for Laity Sunday was actually in 1928. At this time, it was known as Laymen's Sunday and wasn't officially mentioned in the Book of Discipline until 1944. It wasn't until 1972 that the Book of Discipline changed to the more gender-neutral Laity Sunday as we know it today.

The United Methodist Church gives anyone the opportunity to become a lay person. (Learn more at <u>Holston.org</u> or <u>umc.org.</u>) Different levels of lay ministry allow people to serve as they feel led and open the door to many exciting ways to grow in faith and leadership.
