In celebration of students of all types, the UMC celebrates UM Student Day on Sunday, November 25. The purpose is a call to the church to, "support students as they prepare for life in uniting faith and knowledge" (UMC Book of Discipline). Offerings provide scholarships and loans to deserving UM students. Participating conferences may award scholarships to UM students who reside in the Conference or will attend a UM related college or university.

UM Student Day is an official Special Sunday in the UMC. I hope you will consider gifts and prayers toward our UM students. As we celebrate the students within our own congregation at CUMC, we can also remember all those UM students out there who are changing the world in the name of faith and love.
